#### FORFEIT OF PREMIUMS

No one will be allowed to interfere with judges. Any person interfering, by letter or otherwise, will be excluded from competition and forfeit all premiums awarded.

The judges will award premiums only on articles listed in the premium list. The decisions of a judge shall be final.

NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN FOR EXHIBITS REJECTED FOR NOT CONFORMING WITH FAIR RULES AND REGULATIONS.

#### ENTRIES

Entries open Monday, July 9 and close Saturday, July 28, unless stall capacity is reached before closing date. No entries will be accepted before July 9. First come, first served basis.

Only one entry may be made by exhibitor in group classes. No more than two entries may be made in any one class by the same exhibitor.

First day's bedding furnished free of charge. After the first day, bedding will be the responsibility of exhibitor.

First entry list will be final. No added list or changes.

Livestock may be brought in Monday, Aug. 27, from 8 a.m. until 10 p.m. and on Tuesday, Aug. 28, from 8 a.m. UNTIL 4 P.M. Market steers, lambs, goats and dairy beef will be weighed in on Tuesday between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Market swine will be weighed in on Tuesday at 4 p.m. All livestock MUST be in stables by 4 p.m., Tuesday, Aug. 28. Each exhibitor is entitled to one exhibitor's pass. NOTE: No entries will be accepted unless entry fees are paid at the time entries are made.

When completing entries, list breeds separately and keep classes in order. Have entries legible, precise and accurate, or they will be rejected.

#### CAR PASSES MUST BE DISPLAYED AND VISIBLE AT ALL TIMES

Also, clearly indicate which is OPEN, 4-H or Ag-Ed. Entry forms must be signed by 4-H and Ag-Ed Exhibitors, Leaders and Parent or Guardian. Each exhibitor must specify the number of animals and breed included in the entry. All breeding animals must have been registered in the exhibitor's name at least 30 days prior to show.

NOTE: All animals exhibited can automatically be used for contests; however, Allentown Fair Livestock Officials ask that all exhibitors be contacted for permission.

NOTE: Exhibitors will be allowed to leave Fairgrounds for other shows providing they: 1) receive prior permission, 2) they fulfill show requirements at Allentown, and 3) they switch animals to keep pens and stalls full. (Animals used to switch must follow same health rules and regulations.)

NOTE: The Fair reserves the right to accept or reject an entry or to remove from the grounds any objectionable exhibit or attendant without being liable for compensation.

NOTE: The Fair reserves the right to accept or reject entirely, partially or conditionally any entry or application. The management also reserves the right to personally, or to appoint a committee, to inspect all entries after they have arrived, and dismiss any entries that would discredit the Fair.

NOTE: False representation, interference, or discourteous conduct by any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Executive Committee according to the equities of the case or cause for dismissal.

NOTE: All exhibitors must have exhibitor numbers visible at all times when in show ring or no premiums will be awarded.

NOTE: The Fair and their Superintendents will make the final decision on whether animals in questionable health will remain on the grounds, without being liable for compensation.

NOTE: Exhibitors pens will be pre-assigned. All assignments will be final.

**NOTE:** All livestock washing will be done between the wash rack pipes and Ag Hall. Hog washing will be done on the cement behind the hog pens.

**NOTE:** No muzzles allowed on grounds. No bull rings allowed in Steer Show. Buckets of water to be in sheep and goat pens at all times.

**NOTE:** It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to know the judging schedule. Stock must be in the ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out of competition.

**NOTE:** If a junior exhibitor has 2 animals in a class, the junior exhibitor must show one animal. Both exhibitor and leg setter must be juniors; second animal may be shown by another junior.

Barn fans will be limited to one fan every 25', hanging type. No fans will be permitted on the ground.

Livestock MUST be removed on Monday, September 3 before midnight..

The Society will NOT be responsible for any exhibits after 8 P.M. Tuesday.

Any exhibitor not adhering to these rules for the removal of livestock will forfeit any premiums to which they would otherwise have been entitled, and be banned from future shows.

#### PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS

All premiums awarded in the Cattle, Swine, Goat and Sheep Departments will be paid in full by check at the Entry Office on Monday, Sept. 3. All errors on premium checks must be reported by Monday, Sept.10, 2007.

The judge may, in all cases, require exhibitors to show animals (except bulls) outside of the stalls at the time of judging.

All animals must be registered in the recognized herd books of the respective breeds, and each exhibitor must furnish the certificate of registry or transfer of each animal to the Superintendent at the time of judging, or the herd book number of the same. All livestock to be judged according to standards adopted by the breed associations.

**NOTE:** Due to weight variances and weight limits the number of classes will be set by the Superintendent after weighin for all Market Classes for both Open and Youth Shows.

#### LIABILITY

The exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any accident to animals.

When on exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under halter and under control of owner or employee.

No bull over one year old will be allowed on the grounds without a ring in his nose.

#### THE USE OF DRUGS AND/OR ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON THE FAIRGROUNDS IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED. ANYONE VIOLATING THIS PROVISION WILL BE EXPELLED FROM THE GROUNDS.

#### INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS & EXPOSITIONS NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics", fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.

2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.

3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.

4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the

owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/ or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedure performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of any penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

12. Please sign the entry form to indicate your support of this code of ethics. Each exhibitor, parent and leader is required to sign off on this code of ethics.

#### Pennsylvania FAIR AND EXHIBITION Animal Health Requirements and Recommendations

⇒An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship form must accompany each exhibition animal, and must be presented upon arrival at all exhibitions in Pennsylvania.

⇒All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this (preprinted on the CVI requires veterinarian's signature) is required on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) when a CVI is required. Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.

 $\Rightarrow$  Before importing animals from a state or area which is quarantined to prevent the spread of disease, owners must contact the Department to obtain current regulations regarding imports from that state or area.

#### **DEFINITIONS FOR SWINE**

#### **Commercial production swine**

Those swine that are continuously managed and have adequate facilities and practices to prevent exposure to either transitional production or feral swine.

#### Transitional production swine

Those feral swine that are captive or swine that have reasonable opportunities to be exposed to feral swine.

#### Section 3: Pennsylvania Poultry, Waterfowl, Upland Game Birds, Ratites, and Pigeons: A. Requirements:

 $\Rightarrow$  All poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and pigeons entering an exhibition must bear a *unique* individual identification leg band (official PA issued leg bands are not required).

⇒An owner-endorsed health certificate must accompany all Pennsylvania poultry, waterfowl, game birds, ratites, and pigeons, and must include the following:

- •Name and location of exhibition
- •Name, address, and telephone number of the owner
- •A statement that their entries and their flock of

origin are free of evidence of contagious diseases

- •Owner signature and date of that signature
- · Verification of testing for AI and Pullorum

• For pigeons, the certificate must include a description of the birds and a statement that the birds have not originated from a foreign country during the 3-week period prior entry into the exhibition.

 Avian Influenza Clean Testing and Verification:
 All poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites, (pigeons excluded) for exhibition must originate from a flock in good standing in the Pennsylvania Avian Influ enza Monitored Flock Program, the NPIP U.S. AI Clean Program, or the NPIP AI Monitored Program;

#### or

• 11 birds from the flock must have had a negative official test within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition.

⇒Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Testing and Verification:

• All poultry, upland game birds, and ratites (pigeons and waterfowl excluded) must come from NPIP U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flocks;

#### $\mathbf{or}$

• Individual birds for exhibition must have had a negative pullorum-typhoid test within the 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The following age restric tions apply to comply with NPIP standards:

- Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.
- Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older.
- Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older, or upon sexual maturity, whichever comes first.
- Ratites shall be tested at 12 months of age or older.
- All birds not meeting these age restrictions must come from a flock in which all of the birds in the flock have been test negative within the 90 days prior to the exhibition.

•Verification of NPIP U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flock status or a current official test status form must accompany all poultry, upland game birds, and ratites.

#### B. Recommendations to Reduce the Risk of Disease:

Infectious Laryngotracheitis (ILT) Vaccination: All chickens for exhibition must be from flocks vaccinated against infectious laryngotracheitis no more than one (1) year and no less than thirty (30) days before opening day of the show. The vaccine used must be one approved by the Department and must be administered in full accor dance with manufacturer's instructions.

#### Section 4: Out of State Poultry:

#### A. Requirements:

⇒All poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and pigeons entering an exhibition must bear an individual identification leg band. Ratites must be identified with a neck band or an electronic implant device (the exhibitor must supply a reader).

⇒An owner-endorsed health certificate must accompany all out of state poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, ratites, and pigeons, and must include the following:

- •Name and location of exhibit
- •Name, address, and telephone number of the owner
- •A statement that their entries and their flock of origin
- are free of evidence of contagious diseases
- ${\boldsymbol{\cdot}} \operatorname{Owner}$  signature and date of that signature
- ${\boldsymbol{\cdot}}$  Verification of testing for AI and Pullorum

• For pigeons, the certificate must include a description of the birds and a statement that the birds have not originated from a foreign country during the 3-week period prior entry into the exhibition

#### ⇒Avian Influenza Clean Testing and Verification:

• Poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites pigeons excluded) shall only be allowed into the Common wealth and the exhibition after meeting one of the follow ing requirements

• The birds originate from a flock that participates in the current version of the National Poultry Improvement Plan and Auxiliary Provisions "U.S. Avian Influenza Clean" program and the shipment is accompanied by a USDA form 9-3 or other NPIP form;

#### or

• The birds originate from a flock that participates in a state, foreign nation, or foreign provincial-sponsored avian influenza monitoring program and the shipment is accompanied by a document from the state, nation, or province of origin indicating participation;

#### or

• The birds originate from a flock in which a minimum of thirty (30) birds, three (3) weeks of age or older, were tested negative for avian influenza (serology, virus isolation, or real-time reverse-transcriptase polymerase chain reaction (RRT-PCR)) within the 30 days prior to opening date of the exhibition and the birds are accompanied by the test report. If there are fewer than 30 birds in the flock, test all birds (RRT-PCR, virus isolation, or serology);

#### $\mathbf{or}$

• Each bird destined for import from a flock not known tobe test-positive for AI is tested (RRT-PCR or virus isolation only);

 $\mathbf{or}$ 

• The birds originate from a flock that participates in an equivalent testing/surveillance program, as approved by the Pennsylvania State Veterinarian.

• Birds from flocks that are serologically positive shall not be imported unless the flock is determined to be free of virus by virtue of a negative virus detection test (virus isolation or RRT-PCR) of oropharyngeal, tracheal and/or

cloacal specimens from a minimum of 150 birds. If there are fewer than 150 birds in the flock, test all birds.

⇒Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Testing and Verification:

• All poultry, upland game birds, and ratites (pigeons and waterfowl excluded) must come from NPIP U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flocks;

#### or

• Individual birds for exhibition must have had a negative pullorum-typhoid test within the 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The following age restric tions apply to comply with NPIP standards:

• Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.

Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older.
Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older orupon sexual maturity, whichever comes first.
All birds not meeting these age restrictions must come

from a flock in which all of the birds in the flock have been test negative within the 90 days prior to the exhibition.

#### **B.** Recommendations to Reduce the Risk of Disease:

Infectious Laryngotracheitis (ILT) Vaccination: All chickens for exhibit must be from flocks vaccinated against infectious laryngotracheitis no more than one (1) year and no less than thirty (30) days before opening day of the show. The vaccine used must be one approved by the Department and must be administered in full accordance with manufacturer's instructions.

#### Section 5: Pennsylvania Swine for Exhibition:

#### A. Requirements:

Individual animal ID is required. ID options include the following:

a. A form of official ID (herd tattoo in combination with an ear notch; or a state issued metal ear tag; or a Radio Frequency Identification tag); OR
b. A plastic stamped ear tag.

#### B. Recommendations to Reduce the Risk of Disease:

•A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is recommended.

# Section 6: Pennsylvania Breeding Swine for Sale at Exhibition:

#### A. Requirements:

 $\Rightarrow$  A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required for breeding swine being sold and must be issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the sale at the exhibition.

 $\Rightarrow$  Individual animal ID is required. ID options include the following:

a. A form of official ID (herd tattoo in combination with an ear notch; or a state issued metal ear tag; or a Radio Frequency Identification tag); OR
b. A plastic stamped ear tag.

**Recommendations to Reduce the Risk of Disease:** 

Individual official animal identification is recommended.

# Section 7: Out of State Swine for Exhibition and Sale at Exhibition:

#### A. Requirements:

 $\Rightarrow$  A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required for breeding swine being sold and must be issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the sale at the exhibition.

 $\Rightarrow$  Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes a herd tattoo in combination with an ear notch; or a state issued metal ear tag; or a Radio Frequency Identification tag.

⇒Testing requirements:

• Commercial Swine:

♦Pseudorabies:

• No Pseudorabies testing is required for commercial

swine originating from a Stage V Pseudorabies-free state.

• If the commercial swine are not from a Stage V Pseudo rabies-free state, contact the Department for testing requirements.

♦Brucellosis:

• No Brucellosis testing is required for commercial swine originating from a Brucellosis-free state.

If the commercial swine are not from a Brucellosis-free state, contact the Department for testing requirements.
Transitional Swine:

♦Pseudorabies:

• Pseudorabies testing is required for transitional swine originating from a Stage V Pseudorabies-free state as well as from a non-Stage V Pseudorabies-free state. Contact the Department for testing requirements.

#### ♦Brucellosis:

• Brucellosis testing is required for transitional swine

#### Section 8: Pennsylvania Cattle for Exhibition: A. Requirements:

There are no exhibition requirements for cattle.

#### B. Recommendations to Reduce the Risk of Disease:

 $\Rightarrow$  A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is recommended.

⇒Individual official animal identification is recommended. Official ID includes a USDA issued metal ear tag or a Radio Frequency Identification tag.

⇒Vaccinations against the following diseases are recommended:

$\cdot$ RabieS	• IBR	• PI3
• BRSV	• BVD	

⇒All drug and vaccine label directions must be followed, including but not limited to milk and slaughter withdrawal periods, and the final dose of vaccine must be administered at least 15 days prior to entry into the exhibition.

#### Section 9: Pennsylvania Cattle for Sale at Exhibition: A. Requirements:

 $\Rightarrow$  For exhibition sale *breeding* cattle, a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the sale at the exhibition is required.

⇒Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes a USDA issued metal ear tag or a Radio Frequency Identification tag.

#### Recommendations to Reduce the Risk of Disease:

A"Veterinarian's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient-Relationship" form or a "Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship" form must be presented upon arrival at all shows and fairs in Pennsylvania, including out of state entries.

#### THIS RULE MUST BE COMPLIED WITH. THE FAIR **RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ACCEPT OR REJECT AN ENTRY** OR TO REMOVE FROM THE GROUNDS ANY **OBJECTIONABLE EXHIBIT OR ATTENDANT WITHOUT** BEING LIABLE FOR COMPENSATION.

1. When filling out entry blanks, specify class for each specimen; state breed, color and marking, sex and whether old or young from this year. Band numbers are optional on pigeon entries. Enter in order of old male, old female, young male, young female for each variety. Exhibitor tickets are to be ordered and paid for at the time entry blanks are submitted (six exhibitor tickets for \$6.00).

2. Due to limited cooping facilities, the entry clerk reserves the right to limit the number of exhibits entered by each exhibitor.

3. Entry fees - \$1.00 for single Pigeon, Bantam and Standard Poultry. Entry fees are payable when entries are made. Make check payable to Allentown Fair.

4. ENTRIES MUST BE MADE ON OFFICIAL ENTRY BLANKS LOCATED IN THE BACK OF THIS BOOK. COPIES CAN BE MADEOFTHESE ENTRY PAGES. ENTRIES MUST BE MADE ENTERED IN SEQUENCE AS IN THE PERMIAN LIST. YOU MUST SPECIFY CORRECT CLASS NUMBER. IF THERE ARE ERRORS ON THE ENTRY THE SECRETARY SHALL RETURN THOSE ENTRIES FOR CORRECTION AND THEY MUST BE RETURNED BEFORE THE CLOSING DAY AND ARE CONSIDEREDFOR ENTRY UPON FINAL RECEIPT. Pennsylvania exhibitors will have preference.

5.Department superintendents are responsible for checking all Certificate of Veterinary Inspections and have the final judgement in resolving any dispute.

6. All entries of live poultry, whether for exhibition or educational purposes, shall be accompanied by a declaration or certification from the owner or exhibitor that to the best of his/her knowledge, the poultry entries and source flock or flocks are free from any evidence of transmissible disease.

7. The certificate of declaration shall contain the date of pullorum disease blood testing, name and address of the owner or exhibitor, name and location of the show; also the number, breed, species, and identification band number of each bird to be exhibited.

8. Since all birds returned from the show are potential sources of infection to other birds, they should be isolated immediately after their return, separate and apart from all other birds. This isolation should be maintained indefinitely, if possible, or at least until it has been established that the birds are not carriers of disease producing agents as may be determined by exposure of a few susceptible birds to direct contact.

9. It is suggested that the birds entered, or the entire flock from which they come, be immunized against those diseases for which approve vaccines and methods are available. (New Castle, Bronchitis, Pox may be optional.)

10. Health certificates of pullorum eradication, which must be completed and accompany the fowl entries, can be obtained from the PA Dept. of Ag. Bureau of Animal Health and Diagnostic Services, Rm 410 Agricultural Bldg., 2301 N. Cameron Street, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9408 Phone 717-783-8555.

11. Flock owners must endorse official certification that all poultry and birds for exhibit originate from flocks free of evidence of contagious diseases.

12. Pennsylvania chickens must be from home flocks vaccinated for laryngotracheitis (LT) no more than 1 year and no less than 30 days before opening date. LT vent brush vaccine must never be used. Use vaccine for intranasal or introcular administration only.

13. The management reserves the right to reject or disqualify any sick or poorly conditioned specimen.

14. No changes or substitutions will be permitted after acceptance of any entry except in same breed, class, color and sex.

15.Exhibits will be received starting Saturday 9 a.m.- 3 p.m., August 25, and all must be cooped in 9 a.m.- 4 p.m. on Sunday,

August 26. It is required for each exhibitor to coop in and remove his or her own exhibits. Exhibits MUST be removed from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday, Labor Day, September 3, 2007. No exhibits are to be removed at any other time. Violation of this rule automatically voids all premium money due violator.

16.Exhibitors will receive lists with coop numbers for each individual specimen, to be placed in the coop with the specified number thereon. Where conditions permit, birds owned by the same exhibitor may be double-cooped.

17. No specimen is to be handled by anyone except the owner, the judges, or members of the show management, unless permission is granted by the owner.

18. Young specimens shall not be considered eligible for competition unless they have reached two-thirds mature development.

19. No exhibit shall be marked in any way by exhibitor except by the use of official bands.

20. Distinctive names or markings shall not be placed on the display coops prior to judging. After the awards are made, advertising material suitable to the management may be placed on the cages. 21. Judging will begin at 9 a.m. on Monday, August 27.

22. After exhibits have been judged, the changing of the original exhibit is forbidden. Violation of this RULE will result in forfeit of all awards and premiums plus refusal of entries for two years.

23. Only one bird is necessary to fill a class.

24. Varieties of Pigeons, Bantams and Standard Poultry having 10 or more birds entered therein will be awarded \$15.00 cash for Champion of the variety. There also will be a Grand Champion selected in Pigeon, Bantam and Standard Poultry which will be awarded \$20.00 cash and a Trophy. NOTE: 4-H and AG-ED Exhibitors: There will be ribbons awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.

25. Exhibitors - Each bird must be banded or it will not be judged or eligible for any award. All young birds MUST be banded with a SEAMLESS recognizable band of current year.

**SPECIAL NOTICE:** When cooping in your birds, be sure to MARK BAND NUMBERS on coop tag for each bird.

26. The greatest possible care will be given to all exhibits, but the Allentown Fair will not be responsible for any accidents, mistakes, theft, fire loss or damage that occurs. Competent employees will be in attendance.

27. **SPECIAL NOTICE:** Any bird entered that is not of the proper requirements for the breed will be disqualified.

28. The Fair reserves the right to accept or reject entirely, partially or conditionally any entry or application. The management also reserves the right to personally, or to appoint a committee, to inspect all entries after they have arrived, and dismiss any entries that would discredit the Fair.

**OUT OF STATE POULTRY** 

All poultry and hatching eggs must originate from a flock in which a minimum of twenty birds, four weeks of age,or older, were tested serologically negative for avian influenza within ten days of shipment and the shipment is accompanied by the test report.

- 3. AG-ED entries are limited to members of the Ag-Ed. Members are eligible to enter any category.
- All 4-H entries, except animals, must be on exhibit in Agricultural Hall by 5:00 p.m., Sunday, August 27. Beef cattle, dairy cattle, goats, sheep, and swine are to arrive BEFORE 4 P.M., Tuesday, August 29. All Ag-Ed entries, except animals, must be on exhibit in Agricultural Hall by 11:00 a.m., Tuesday, August 29. Beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, swine and goats are to
- arrive BEFORE 4 P.M., **Tuesday**, August 29.
  5. Members with animal projects must show their own animals. FREE STRAW WILL BE FURNISHED FOR THE FIRST DAY ONLY.
- 6. Any exhibitor who brings in an animal exhibit by car or truck shall be entitled to a free pass for entry and parking. Use gates as marked on pass issued. This also applies to exhibitors when tending exhibits.
- For uniformity, most 4-H and Ag-Ed Sections have been combined below. See Judging Schedule on page 6 for dates and times of judging.

8. Exhibits *MUST* specify whether 4-H or Ag-Ed on entry forms. 4-H & VO-AG will be given for Grand Champion Showman for all species.

- 9. 4-H-AG-ED Each animal must be registered in the name of the junior exhibitor only. No reference to farm name or joint ownership is permitted.

- 13. Animals must be owned by exhibitor, and registered by the Extension Office by June 1.

### **DIVISION 1**

Animal health status in these classes shall be governed by the same requirements as open classes. Members must be present to care for their animals before judging starts. Dairy cattle are to be housed in the cattle barn west of Agricultural Hall. Premiums stated apply to each major breed to be judged in Open Show classes of Same Breed and Age.

#### Rules for Lehigh County 4-H Livestock Round-Up Show and Sale of Market Animals

1.All Round-Up steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs, goats, and meat pens must be individually entered in the Allentown Fair by July 7th on the official entry form supplied by their Club Leader. The Club Leaders will deliver the entries to the LivestockSuperintendent at the address listed on the entry form. A 4-H Club Leader or Extensions Agent must sign all entry forms. All participants must be standing members of Lehigh County 4-H.

2.All Round-Up steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs and goats must have a legible numbered ear tag in their ear.

3. Exhibitors may show and sell only one steer.

Exhibitors may show and sell up to three hogs.

Exhibitors may show and sell up to two lambs.

Exhibitors may show and sell only one dairy beef.

Exhibitors may show and sell up to two goats.

Exhibitors may show and sell up to two pens of meat rabbits. All eligible steers, dairy beef, hogs lambs and goats entered must be sold.

4.A list of all potential Round-Up participants must be provided to the Allentown Fair by May 1st to be added to the Premium List mailing.

5.All steers, hogs, and lambs must arrive on the Fairgrounds by 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 28th. Animals can be brought in earlier, but no animals should be unloaded before the Livestock Office person nel check them for proper health papers. The exhibitor is responsible for the care of the animals during their stay at the Allentown Fair.

6.Animal weighing will take place as animals arrive. Weighing of hogs will begin at 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 28. Steers must weigh at least 900 pounds. Hogs must weigh at least 210 pounds and not over 280 pounds; the hog weight limits are subject to change. Please contact your 4-H leader of the Extentions Office one month in advance for additional information. No weight limits for lambs. Blanketed lambs will be reduced by one pound. Exhibitor must be present, or arrange for someone to take his or her animal to the scale during the designated time period. Animals not meeting weight requirements will not be allowed to show in class type, nor be eligible for Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion. Animals not meeting weight requirements will be allowed to sell at the end of their species in the sale order and these animals may be exhibited in showmanship classes. 7.Steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs and goats will be shown in the weight classes and at the time listed in Department 10 - Youth Exhibits of the Allentown Fair Premium List. 8.Judging for Showmanship contest will follow the same schedule that is listed in Department 10 - Youth Exhibits of the Allentown Fair Premium List. Judging for Fitting contest will be done at the same time with Showmanship for Round-Up participants only. There will be no premium given for Fitting.

9.All steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs and goats must be shown and presented at the sale by their owners except if the member is ill, away at school, or absent for other reasons. Each absence must be approved in advance by the Round-Up committee. The animal may then be shown or presented for sale by another 4-H member as an alternate. An alternate Showman or Fitter is not eligible for awards.

10.Set-up for the sale area will begin promptly after the market steer show on Friday evening and resume at approximately 8 a.m. on Saturday, September 1. Round-Up participants shall assist in the set-up and bring their animals to the sale area.

11.The sale will begin at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 1, in the Livestock Tent. The sale order will be announced.

12.Sale order for each species shall be as follows: Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, remaining Champion and Reserve Champion, the remaining first place class winners and so on. A Banner will be awarded to the buyer of each Grand Champion specie, and a Rosette to the buyer of each Reserve Grand Champion specie.

13.A suitable rope halter must be left on each steer after the sale.

14.Current Pennsylvania Health Rules and Regulations for steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs, goats and rabbits apply. SeeHealth Regulations listed in Allentown Fair Premium List.

15.Animals will be sold by the head. Lambs will be sold as singles.

ate 4-H quality assurance program and observe the USDA Wholesome Meat Act Form. All requirements of the 4-H project must be completed to participate in the sale. 17.**Buyers assume ownership of the animals at the time of the sale on Saturday, September 1.** 

Buyers are expected to pay (Pennsylvania checks only) at the time of sale. Round-Up participants are responsible for the care of these animals including feed, water, bedding, and proper health care until release time, beginning at 7:00 a.m. Sunday, September 2. All animals must be removed by 12:00 noon on this day.

18. Under the "buy back program," a buyer who wants to

support the 4-H program without receiving an animal, may sell the animal back to the sponsor of the "buy back program" at the current market price (announced prior to the sale). The buyer would then only pay the difference between the sale price and the current market price. They may register for the "buy back program" just before the sale begins.
